Real Stories

While the Sunshine Phonics books are phonetically-controlled texts, they are also real stories! The stories in the early sets follow the adventures of Sam, Dan and Nat. Young children can relate to the fun storylines and enjoy the humorous endings. Later sets introduce other characters and non-fiction titles.

Words Children Can Read

The Sunshine Phonics books allow children to practise their developing phonic knowledge by reading books that only include the grapheme-phoneme correspondences that they have learnt. Some tricky words (high-frequency words that are not easily decodable) are also learnt as these words are necessary for any story. The result is reading success for all children!

Clear, colourful illustrations support the text and storyline.

Real stories feature the same key characters - Sam, Dan and Nat and their family, pets and friends.





Inside Front Cover

The inside front cover of each book provides the **Before Reading** focus for children. Here they will practise blending sounds to make the words they will meet in the story. Tricky Words are also reviewed.

Before Reading

Synopsis: What a treat to go to the beach! Mum reads while Dad and bub have a dip in the sea. And wow, look at all the amazing sandcastles.

Decoding practice: Display the words 'extreme', 'theme', 'each' and 'seat'.

Can children circle the letter string that makes the /ee/ sound, and read each

Tricky word practice: Display the word 'our'. Ask children to circle the tricky part of the word ('ou' which makes /ow/ sound). Practise writing and reading this word.







Scope and Sequence

Teaching Notes

Explicit small-group lesson plans with a focus on phonics, vocabulary, comprehension and fluency.



Learning Intention

Phonics: Review and practice using the graphemes and phonemes **s s t p i n m d**. Make sure that children can identify and make each of these phonemes, match each phoneme to the appropriate grapheme and read words containing the graphemes.


1. SCREENING TEST

The screening test comprises Phonemes, Words (including decodable words and nonsense words) and Tricky Words. The information is extracted from the Phonics assessment in our Teachers' Books. Phonemes Screening Test







2. PHONICS ASSESSMENT

This part of the **Assessment Kit** is taken from the Teachers' Books. There are two assessments for each Set of each Series, covering phonemes, graphemes, decoding words, and tricky words. Each assessment comprises a teacher sheet and a student sheet. Each assessment can be downloaded separately.









3. ASSESSMENT OF READING ACCURACY (ARA)

The ARA is an assessment of a student's decoding and reading skills. The ARA is based around 18 new unseen texts written by leading international author Susan Frame – there is one unseen text per Set per Series. The ARA comprises a student sheet containing the unseen text plus a marking and analysis sheet for the teacher. The ARA allows teachers to assess how well a student has assimilated their phonics knowledge and word blending skills.

First player to guess correctly gets the cord. Player with most cords wins.

Encourage players to make variations, eg give the beginning sound of the word, the ending sound. If players can't guess the word, an extra clue can be given, eg / use one foot to move it.
